- 2) Writing farmer-focused articles, blogs and other outreach on topics related to field crops production, marketing, supply chains and rural communities for PFI publications and for distribution in other farm-related media outlets.
- 3) Connecting with field crops farmers to learn about their challenges, opportunities and how PFI can serve them.
- 4) Responding to questions from the public about PFI's field crops programming, connecting them to other members with expertise or interest in the topic or to other PFI programs or external service providers.
- 5) Supporting the farmer-led education department in data collection and information management processes.

- **Organize and record information** on PFI members and contacts into CRM and project management software
