Double up on cover crop cost-share

Even with the upfront expense of covers, about 72 percent of farmers in our 2022 cover crop cost-share program reported that **covers positively or very positively impacted their farm financial goals.**

PFI offers \$10 per acre cost-share on unlimited acres. **You can double-up with publicly funded cost-share** on the same acres (about 64 percent of PFI cost-share participants also received public cost-share last year). <u>Check your eligibility and enroll.</u>

Research report: Cover Crop Effect on Soil Water



Landon Brown, Will Cannon, Jeremy Gustafson, Aaron Lehman and Sam Ose participated in a multistate trial to examine the effect of cereal rye cover crops on corn and soybean yield as well as soil moisture.

"[This research] will validate that our current cover crop practices are working or if we need to make changes," Will Cannon said at the beginning of the project.
