

New Self-Paced On-Farm Poultry Processing Course Available

Cornell Small Farms Program has launched a new self-paced online course for On-Farm Poultry Processing, with detailed videos and lessons on food safety and humane techniques for dispatching and processing chickens and turkeys on-farm under the 1000-bird exemption. The course will take 3-4 hrs to complete, and if you pass all of the quizzes, a Certificate of Completion will be automatically issued to you. This certificate may be accepted by your insurer to underwrite your poultry operation, but they cannot guarantee that it will result in coverage. Course pricing is tiered based on household income from \$49 - \$99. Learn more and register.

BIPOC Farmer Micro-Grants

Rodale Institute, in partnership with Organic Farmers Association, offers a micro-grant program to support small-scale Black, Indigenous & People of Color (BIPOC) farmers, whether organic, transitioning to organic, or aspiring to organic. Funding should have the potential to positively impact a farmer's transition to organic, allow them to better market their products, or solve a particular problem that is typically un-fundable through normal operational or lending strategies. Project budgets should be between \$500 and \$2,000. Applications are due by March 31, 2021.

Value-Added Producer Grant (Amended Notice)

USDA Rural Business-Cooperative Service has amended its Solicitation of Applications to offer approximately \$76 million in matching funds through the Value-Added Producer Grant program. This USDA program helps agricultural producers enter into value-added activities related to the processing and/or marketing of bio-based, value-added products. Generating new products, creating and expanding marketing opportunities, and increasing producer income are the goals of this program. The grant program awards up to \$250,000 for working capital and \$75,000 for planning. Electronic applications must be received by April 29, 2021; paper applications must be postmarked by May 4, 2021.
