While our field days will look different this year, we are confident these events will help you stay connected as you learn from one another about production, business and conservation strategies.



On-farm jobs now available through Labor4Learning



Farm Aid Relief Payments

PFI is partnering with Farm Aid and the Iowa Farmers Union to provide one-time \$500 emergency relief payment to farm families. Awards are intended as emergency relief for farmers and their families. Use of the funds is restricted to household expenses, such as groceries, home utilities, medical bills, counseling, or other household expenses not directly related to the commercial operation of the farm or ranch.
