opportunities that can be used for a wide array of projects that support
rare breed conservation within the U.S. and are intended to support both
individuals and organizations. Each grant may be used for expenditures
including, but not limited to, producer training programs, fencing, facilities,
supplies, specialized equipment, meat and egg production, Agri-tourism, wool
processing, or product marketing. All Microgrant awards typically range from
\$500 - \$2,000 and will be at the discretion of The Livestock Conservancy.
