PRACTICAL FARMERS OF IOWA SAVINGS INCENTIVE PROGRAM



Getting a start in farming can be difficult, and sometimes you need a little guidance to keep you on track. The Savings Incentive Program (SIP) was created as part of an effort to help beginners establish viable, sustainable farm businesses. The program was structured with input from beginning farmers, and direction from established farmers.

Who is Eligible?

- 1. Applicants must either be farming on their own now and have farmed for five or fewer years, or have some experience working for a farm business.
- 2. Must reside in Iowa or farm in the state.
- 3. Must be a member of Practical Farmers of Iowa.



How do I Apply?

Savings Incentive Program Applications are NOW OPEN for the 2020-2021 class. <u>Submit your application by October 11, 2019.</u>

SIP Application Tips

Application period is open from August 21 - October 11, 2019. A selection committee of experienced PFI members determine those accepted into the program. To build a strong application, consider the following:

Pop-up Farminar: Iowa Farm Lease Law



Join on September 3rd

As of 2017, Iowa had 86,214 farms. Of those, almost 38% were farmed under a cash rent lease, and 5.6% were farmed pursuant to a crop share lease. Given these numbers, it is crucial that Iowa landowners and producers understand the legal implications and requirements of their farmland leases.

Free DIY Plans for Mobile Chicken Coop

As part of their Slow Tools projects, the Stone Barns Center has made available plans for farmers to build their own mobile chicken coop. The coops are built with easily accessible materials and designed to be customizable for each farmer's particular operation.

Updated SoilWeb App Available

USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the University of California at Davis Soil Resource Laboratory have released version 2.0 of the free SoilWeb app. SoilWeb provides users with information on soil types associated with their location, based on information from the National Cooperative Soil Survey. The new version has a cleaner and more modern interface, as well as detailed digital soil-survey data.

<u>Addressing Challenges of Specialty Cut Flower Production</u>

A study published in HortTechnology shared the results of an industry survey of North American specialty cut flower producers. The main perceived production problem was insect management, with crop timing second, and disease management third. The main postharvest problems were temperature management, hydration, and flower-food management. The article provides a guide for how to best address those challenges, using 31 major crop species as a template.
