DNR to offer leases to beginning farmers

Beginning farmers have the opportunity to manage DNR land through the DNR's Agriculture Lease Program in 2020, in part to legislation passed in 2013. To participate in the beginning farmer program, the producer must be a permanent resident of Iowa, have appropriate skills and have a net worth of less than \$680,590.
