
# Get your farm office organized with winter reading!

#### **Brighter Future Fund**

American Farmland Trust is accepting applications for the Brighter Future Fund 2022-23 grant cycle. Applications for grants up to \$5,000 funding farm projects building resilience and displaying innovation are encouraged.
