Produce Safety Cost-Share Enrollment Through Dec. 15

PFI is excited to announce the opening of our Produce Safety Cost-Share for fruit and vegetable farmers seeking to make on-farm food safety improvements. To receive cost-share, producers must complete the Produce Safety Alliance Grower Training (or already hold the PSA certificate). PSA Grower Trainings through ISU Extension are offered in-person and online during December and January for only \$20. See the list of trainings here.

USDA Micro Farm Eligibility Self-Assessment Tool

The Carrot Project has created this tool that is designed to help you determine your eligibility for USDA's newest insurance program. Micro Farm insurance is a new insurance program available from the USDA, made specifically for small-scale, diversified growers making up to \$350,000 annually. This self-assessment tool should take less than five minutes to get through (it's just eight questions long) and provides general guidance.

Beginning Farmer Institute

The National Farmers Union's Beginning Farmer Institute is currently accepting applications until December 16. This is a free, year-long training program intended to improve the business health of participants' operations. It is tailored for all types of producers and those either starting their own operations or taking over family businesses.

Fund-a-Farmer Grant

FACT awards competitive grants of up to \$3,000 to working, independent farmers located in the 50 United States and five major U.S. territories who raise beef cattle, bison, broiler chickens, dairy cows, ducks, geese, goats, laying hens, pigs, sheep and/or turkeys. The deadline for livestock and poultry farmers to apply is January 10, 2023. Grants will be awarded in March 2023.

National Farmers Mentoring Program

After attending one of National Farmers' farmer educational seminars or online learning series, you are eligible for a mentorship. You can interact with your mentor through the two field days a year, and via telephone calls, text or email messages, depending on what works for the mentor.
