Roller-crimping an overwintered cover crop is an sound alternative to herbicide termination. In this video, **Scott Shriver** explains how roller crimping works on his Jefferson, IA organic farm. Roller-crimping should occur at anthesis or pollen-shed of the rye.

For plenty of biomass and better weed suppression, Scott typically drills two to three bushels/acre of cereal rye in the fall. He has had success with ND Gardner

rye, which accumulates a lot of biomass before roll-down. Scott has also been recommended Danko rye, which has early anthesis and rolls-down effectively.

## **Iowans: Apply for Water Quality Initiative cost share today!**

First-time cover croppers are eligible for \$25 per acre, while farmers who have experience using cover crops are continuing the practice can receive \$15 per acre. Reduced tillage and nitrapyrin nitrification inhibitor cost share is also available.

Cost share funding through IDALS is capped at 160 acres per farmer or landowner. Contact your <u>local Soil and Water Conservation District office</u> today to submit an application!
