

A drought in the Dakotas and parts of Canada will limit cover crop seed availability this year. Brothers **Josh and Micah Rensink** farm and run <u>Pivotal Farm Services</u> – a cover crop seed and application business near Sioux Center, IA. Micah says, "We've done our own forecasting, and we expect that cover crop seed prices are going up."

Supply limitations: "It goes back to supply and demand," Micah explains, "We've got low supply because of the drought in the Dakotas and because fewer people kept their rye crop for seed due to high corn and soybean prices. We're expecting increased demand as more and more people see how cover crops benefit soil."

Act now: Micah advises, "Whether you're a veteran cover cropper or new to it, talk to your supplier soon because prices are going up. Now is the time to get your price locked in."

PROGRAM UPDATES

Deadline for \$5/acre Pandemic Cover Crop Program is June 15, 2021

If you seeded cover crops in 2020, you are likely eligible to receive a \$5/acre crop insurance premium discount through the Pandemic Cover Crop
Program. The discount will be applied to the 2021 crop insurance premium.
Farmers in Iowa, Illinois, and Indiana who received the \$5/acre cover crop - crop insurance premium discount are eligible for an additional \$5/acre through the Pandemic Cover Crop Program.

To be eligible for the discount, you must certify all cover cropped acres seeded in 2020 with your local USDA-FSA office **by June 15, 2021.**

Iowans: Apply for Water Quality Initiative cost share today!

First-time cover croppers are eligible for \$25 per acre, while farmers who have experience using cover crops and are continuing the practice can receive \$15 per acre. Reduced tillage and nitrapyrin nitrification inhibitor cost share is also available.

Cost share funding through IDALS is capped at 160 acres per farmer or landowner. Contact your <u>local Soil and Water Conservation District</u>
