Establishment is compared in corn and soybeans for brassicas, grass and legumes. Species include winter wheat, hairy vetch, rapeseed and more!

Research: Camelina ahead of corn and soybeans

Key findings from this <u>2020</u>
<u>Cooperators' Program Report</u> on winter camelina as a cover crop ahead



of corn and soybeans show the cover had no effect on yields.

Three farms were involved in the trial and the winter camelina overwintered at two and winter-killed at the third.
