Small grains bids are higher than average for 2022, but understanding the economic benefits of growing small grains requires looking beyond just one year. Join **Jeff Steffen** for our January **shared learning call** as he walks through the ways small grains increase his bottom line across his

three- and five-year rotations. From reducing nitrogen fertilizer in corn to saving costs on untreated seed, Jeff will explain how his whole system makes money.



Jeff Steffen farms on 600 acres near Crofton, Nebraska with his wife Jolene. The Steffens raise corn, soybeans, oats, rye and peas and they custom graze cowcalf pairs on their 200 acres of pasture.

Harvesting small grains in 2022? Sweeten the pot with cost share!

Farmers in **Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska and Wisconsin** with conventional or transition-to-organic small grain acres are still eligible for cost share of **\$15 per acre** when they follow their small grain with a legume cover crop. On top of that, we have **additional cost share** for taking a nitrogen fertilizer credit in corn that follows a small grain in an extended rotation.


