Elmarie Nel of Clarion Locker and Blake Hansen of Hansen's Dairy shared some insights at PFI's 2022 annual conference about how they work together and keep an open line of communication to deliver the best end products.

Valuable insights for the *producer*:

- Schedule in advance and drop off the correct number of animals on time.
- Do the customer service work with your customers up-front. Explain how processing and pricing work and answer questions.
- Communicate mistakes but also communicate a job well done.



The Good Meat Breakdown has <u>free graphics for communicating with your customers about how their meat is processed.</u>



Valuable insights for the *processor*:

- Set up an initial meeting with new customers to talk about their goals, your processing methods and why some things may and may not be possible for their products.
- Admit mistakes and work to correct them.


This summer, the Nels' participated in a Live from the Farm episode and gave a tour of their locker. Watch the episode!


BEYOND THE GATE

The Omega-3 fatty acid concentration was greatest in the grain-free group.
