
Meet-up with hort farmers in your area this winter

Food Safety Certification for Specialty Crops Program

Safety Certification for Specialty
Crops Program provides support for specialty crop farms that incurred eligible on-farm food safety expenses related to getting/renewing a food safety certificate. FSCSC will cover a percentage of the specialty crop operation's cost of obtaining or renewing their certification, as well as a percentage of their related expenses.



FSCSC applications are accepted through Jan. 31, 2023.
