Meet a Co-Hort: Kate Solko

Kate Solko started working in organic vegetable production around 2010 and today is the owner-operator of **Root to Rise Organic Farm** in Ames, Iowa.

Why you grow horticulture crops, in 5 or fewer words: because I love beautiful food.

Something you're excited about trying this year: My cucumber tunnel! We're growing seedless cucumbers trellised on a single leader. They are parthenocarpic so don't need to be pollinated and can be covered to exclude pests the whole season. The whole tunnel is full of perfect cucumbers!





What you would change about your

industry: I get anxious seeing spray planes flying close to us this time of year. I don't fault farmers for their choices or practices, but my organic certification - which we worked for years to get - feels at risk with every spray plane I see. Overall, I wish National Organic Program rules and regs were more supportive of small, highly diversified operations rather than large, industrial-scale farmers.

Favorite PFI memory: At my first PFI Conference, I was heading toward the door because I experience a lot of social anxiety. But Beth Wilbur grabbed me

and just said, "You should stay." She told me I belonged here, and that meant a lot.

Favorite crop and why: Winter squash! It has so many shapes, sizes and colors, and is so beautiful. It's a personal challenge to grow it because of the pests and diseases, but we've figured it out. It keeps for so long and helps us eat local all winter.


