Amber Mohr and her family started Fork Tail Farm seven years ago in Avoca, Iowa, where they produce pasture-raised meat and poultry. A beginning farmer herself, Amber has relied on the wisdom of experienced farmers to help her navigate farm decisions.

Three years ago, Amber became a <u>Farmland Access Navigator for Renewing the</u> <u>Countryside</u> to help others prepare to search for and access farmland.

We asked Amber: What is the first step a beginning farmer should take when looking for land?

"Identify your goals for the land considering your lifestyle and entrepreneurial endeavors. **Bring in your stakeholders,** family and partners early," Amber says. "Keep these goals in mind while you look for land. It is easy to quickly fall in love with land even though it may not meet your needs."
