As the sun stays lower on the horizon, and temperatures finally start to cool off from a summer of record highs, it finally feels like fall is here. With the days for forage growth numbered, it's time to be thinking about winter feed plans. The University of Wisconsin Extension published a <u>fact sheet and guide to bale</u> <u>grazing</u>. The slow forage regrowth due to drought this year has led many to feed bales for much of the summer and fall. Keeping livestock on pasture and

continuing to feed hay in a strategic and optimized system can decrease costs while benefitting soil health and fertility.
