Why do you grow hort crops, in 5 words or less? Growing unique things customers want.

What is something you're excited about trying this year? Flowers! We love them, and we tried a u-pick this year. They're also great for the bees to have different kind of flowers and nectar.

What is one thing you would change about your industry? We want more water! Our wells are so low. That's not really the industry, but it's an issue. We like what we do because we hone in on really specialty items that we know people want, so that has been helpful for us.
