Several years ago, beginning sheep farmer **Stennie Nelson** (above left) was looking to move her starter flock to begin farming independently. She met a potential landlord at the PFI's virtual annual conference in 2021, but was intimidated by the lease negotiation process and wasn't sure how to start.

After learning about PFI's Farmland Access Navigator program, she was connected with **Amber Mohr**, who helped her advocate for a lease that met the needs of her growing business. Once on the land, Amber helped Stennie think through infrastructure and systems for the new farm.

Today, Stennie leases about 34 acres of land near Turin, Iowa, along with adjacent wildlife management areas.

"Amber has been a steadfast support, helping me keep perspective during these first few challenging years as I was trying to figure everything out seemingly at once," Stennie says.
