Cultivating connections at Iowa City's Global Food Project

The Global Food Project's incubator farm in Iowa City, Iowa, has been fostering community and creating space for immigrants to grow traditional foods since 2016.

In this article from our Autumn 2023 magazine, meet Emmanuel Gauthier Mfuankatu and Blandine Matondo, who grow Congolese foods on plots at the GFP farm.

"When I am [at Global Food Project], I think of home because everyone at home has a garden and grows food this way," Emmanuel says. "Last year, we were less than 10 African families. Now we are more than 30. It is very important. It means we didn't forget our habit and culture and how to make our food."
