### Preserving flavor and diversity with heirloom apple varieties



In a market focused on commercial attributes like uniformity, color and crunch, heirloom apple varieties face challenges, with many lost and only around 2,500 still grown in the U.S.

While newer varieties dominate, some growers are maintaining heirlooms for flavor and pest resistance.

They also share how these structures benefit their operation by letting them grow fresh salad greens from April through November, and by helping them restore soil fertility with a cover crop that includes a legume.
