Caring for livestock in the cold

The snow is finally here! Next, it seems, comes the cold. While snow is welcome moisture and an insulating layer on the soil, the cold has fewer upsides. Cold animals use more energy to warm themselves up, so feed requirements go accordingly. It's also harder to make skinny animals gain weight, the energy loss can be a vicious cycle. **This fact sheet** from the University of Minnesota Extension can act as a checklist of things to keep an eye on in the cold; from water access to windbreaks to bedding.
