New grant opportunities for infrastructure and equipment

Food and farm businesses taking part in regional food distribution and wholesale markets are encouraged to apply for the new Iowa Resilient Food System Infrastructure program grants:

- Infrastructure grants: \$100,000 to \$1 million (pre-proposal and consultation call due by Feb. 23)
- Equipment-only grants: \$10,000 to \$100,000 for new, used or refurbished equipment (preproposals due March 8)

Iowa RFSI is part of the USDA's American Rescue Plan, receiving over \$5 million to support infrastructure for the middle of the food supply chain. <u>View application details.</u>
