Why do you grow hort crops, in five words or less?: That's what directly feeds people.

What is something you're excited about this year?: I am going to try to have an all-purple vegetable share for one week this summer. Probably late August or

early September, including eggplant, purple beans, purple cabbage, mizuna, purple carrots and beets.

What is one thing you would change about your industry?: The obvious one is to get more people to eat vegetables. It would be great to have more growers and more markets for those growers to fill.

Favorite PFI memory: This year's conference! We presented a session on living mulches this year, and this was our first PFI conference. It was welcoming and technical and there was a good mix of different growers. And good food!

Your favorite crop and why: Peppers! I love eating them and I love the varieties – sweet, shishitos, hot peppers, so many kinds! I don't feel like I'm working when I'm harvesting peppers; I could just do that all day long.
