Why do you grow hort crops, in five words or less?: To share my farm's magic!

What is something you're excited about this year?: I'm excited about our Farm School. Farm School is a 45-minute program we offer on Fridays from June through August with lessons on pollinators, chickens, flowers and more for school-aged children. Thanks to sponsorship from Fareway, the program is fully complimentary. I love children and I'm passionate about educating and helping kids experience new things. Last year, we saw upwards of 250 kids each week, and for our carnival at the end, we had 638 kids!

What is one thing you would change about your industry?: I wish there were KPIs (key performance indicators) across the board and that we could take a deep dive into the profit and loss. I would love to have mentors who really understand business and could help farmers understand how to be more profitable.


Favorite PFI memory: The 2020 conference, which was my very first exposure to PFI. Every single educator and listening and learning with everyone was so excellent.

New grant opportunity for infrastructure and equipment



The <u>Iowa Resilient Food Systems</u>
<u>Infrastructure Program</u> aims to build resilience into the food supply chain in Iowa. Through this program, two types of grants are available:

- Infrastructure grants from \$100,000 to \$1 million (preproposal and consultation call due by Feb. 23)
- Equipment-only grants from \$10,000 to \$100,000 for new, used or refurbished equipment (pre-proposals due March 8)

Farms and food businesses are encouraged to apply.
