Many farmers are now making plans for terminating their fall cover crop before planting corn this spring. If you're one of them, <u>check out this 2022 blog post</u> where **Stefan Gailans,** PFI's senior research manager, summarizes on-farm research results.

Here are three takeaways.

• Avoid letting the cover crop compete for moisture and nutrients, which could negatively affect corn development.

- If you're considering planting green, make sure the cover crop doesn't grow too tall.
- Increase the physical distance between your cover crop and corn plants by leaving skip zones when seeding the cover crop in the fall or by using aggressive strip-tillage in the spring
