Steve and Ron Rachut help fulfill regional food demand with potatoes and onions at scale

In Fertile, Iowa, rooted in soil that once was a marshland, a few fields look different than others in the area. On a rainy July day, field day guests saw **Steve**

and Ron Rachut's 35-plus acres of onions and potatoes, toured their wholesale-oriented handling facilities and heard how they grow and market their crops.

Attendees also toured the farm and saw potatoes growing in muck (also called peat) soil, which has about 50% organic matter. While ideal for potatoes and onions, muck soil has its challenges, including being prone to erosion. To cope, Steve and Ron plant onions with a nurse crop of oats to prevent seeds from blowing away.

While growing vegetables has real barriers, such as finding a market in a state dominated by grain crops, operations this size are important for fulfilling state and regional demand for food.

"Farmers are responding to consumer interest in where their food comes from," Steve told Mark Dorenkamp of **Brownstone Ag News** during the event.
