Supporting a diverse ecosystem with multi-species grazing at 3 Brothers Farm

Nested in Waukesha County, Wisconsin, **Michael and Courtney Gutschenritter's** 100-acre farm is planted entirely in perennials, including 28 acres of pollinator habitat.

Last Tuesday, over 75 field day participants joined the Gutschenritters to see their operation up close. Guests saw the couple's pasture, which is thick with prairie plants, and learned about the **sliding electric fence systems** for poultry they innovated and have begun popularizing. Attendees also learned how Michael and Courtney raise grass-fed lamb, 120 Shetland sheep and 2,800 laying hens; and how they custom-graze 25 of their neighbor's dairy heifers.

This diversity is the ecological and economic web of the operation. They also sell wool blankets and sheepskins, pastured eggs; and in recent years, and innovative farm manuals.

The field day ended with a meal of lamb gyros, made from meat produced on the farm, and local vegetables. Those who attended the field day were left feeling nourished in more ways than one.

Trialing strip-till vs. no-till soybeans or corn following a cover crop



Does strip-tilling fields after a cover crop affect corn and soybean yield compared with no-tilling? Iowa farmers **Keaton Krueger and Tim Sieren** aimed to find out in their 2023 trial.

Keaton and Tim both use strip tillage to prepare cover-cropped fields for soybean or corn planting. But they both think no-till would be preferable on their operations if there's no large negative yield impact.
