Karri and Patrick Rose create community through flowers and experiences at Rose Farm

On a recent hot summer Sunday, **Karri and Patrick Rose** welcomed more than 80 people to their farm near Norwalk, Iowa, to share their experiences with cut-flower production, agritourism, creating a consistent customer experience and how they weave a focus on sustainability throughout their operation.

In 2019, Karri and Patrick opened Rose Farm to the public. Since then, they have continued to grow their suite of guest experiences, ranging from flower clubs and workshops to farm-to-table dinners, a summer farm school and more.

Guests enjoyed pie, sweet tea and lemonade – all made from recipes Karri inherited from her grandmother (all the gardens on the farm are also named in honor of Karri's and Patrick's grandmothers) – in the farm's retail shop.

The group also had a chance to tour the farm and see flowers growing in the field, the farm's 2 acres of pollinator habitat, high tunnels, a tiny greenhouse they decorate seasonally and rent out to photographers, compost production and young trees Karri and Patrick are growing to plant a shelterbelt.

New research looks at roller-crimping in soybeans



Roller-crimping as a way to kill cover crops has interested farmers in PFI's Coperators' Program for years. Two onfarm trials from 2023 reflect that ongoing curiosity:

- In <u>"Timing of Roll-Crimping a</u> <u>Cereal Rye Cover Crop,"</u> four farmers tested whether the time of crimping affected soybean yield.
- In a second trial, "In-Row Roll-Crimping Cereal Rye Cover Crop Seeded in Twin-Rows Ahead of Soybeans," Michael Vittetoe compared crimping rye in-row compared with chemically killing it.
