New PFI research trial aims to discover if cover crops increase the number of days suitable for field work

Growing cover crops is one way many PFI farmers are challenging prevailing agricultural norms. When grown between and alongside cash crops, cover crops

can reduce erosion, hold moisture, add nutrients back to the soil and boost overall soil health.

Many farmers have anecdotally shared how their cover cropped fields drain more quickly after big rain events, giving them earlier access for field work – and more access across a season.

To date, however, no formal study PFI is aware of has looked at this aspect of cover crops. This year, several farmers launched a new multi-year on-farm research project that seeks to answer, "Do cover crops increase the number of days suitable for field work?"

New research report: "Red Clover vs. Red + Sweet Clover Cover Crops Before Corn"



Green manure cover crops like clovers are often used by organic farmers to provide soil fertility.

Doug Alert and Margaret Smith wondered whether a mix of sweet clover and red clover would be more drought resistant and provide an extra boost to corn yield compared with red clover alone.


