Staff help clean up storm damage at The Berry Patch Farm

On Tuesday, May 21, storms caused significant damage to farms across Iowa.

The Berry Patch Farm in Nevada, Iowa, home to PFI members **Dean, Judy and Mike Henry,** was among those affected.

PFI staff gathered at the farm to clean up a high tunnel that had collapsed in the storm and another that housed raspberries, deconstructing metal frames and

clearing away debris.

While the tunnel pictured above did not yet have plants growing when the storm hit, it had been prepared for melons. The farm also saw damage to 50-year-old pine trees that surround and protect the berry fields.

We know many other farms and PFI members were affected by the severe weather. If you were among them, **federal disaster assistance is available through the U.S. Department of Agriculture.** If you need help cleaning up your farm, you can post about it in our announcements email discussion group.
