Resources for extreme weather challenges

Last year, I apologized that so many of my newsletters started out talking about drought. Well, if nothing else, this year sure is different. Flooding across the Midwest has been dramatic, from flooding across Iowa, to a dam failure near where I grew up in southern Minnesota sending a centuries worth of sediment

pollution downstream. Extreme weather, be it heat, drought, or flood takes a toll on our environment, our homes, our health and our farms. **The Land Stewardship Project** has put together farm crisis resource page with a special section specifically for the 2024 floods. It draws on Minnesota resources but is applicable to farms in surrounding states as well.

Also worth mentioning is a recent discussion in one of PFI's email discussion groups, which are open to PFI members, that highlighted the growing difficulty and expense of getting insurance on farm structures and homes. In response to the interest, PFI's senior horticulture education coordinator, Jacqueline Venner Senske, organized a series of virtual listening sessions for members to share their experiences and discuss what can be done to address the problem.



With all the rain, many pastures are sodden. Even without dramatic floods or standing water, the wet ground can lead to hoof issues with livestock.
