Microgrants to support endangered breeds now open



Livestock Conservancy microgrants of \$500 to \$2,000 can support your efforts to preserve genetic diversity in endangered breeds. Microgrant applications are now open for farmers, ranchers, breed clubs and associations who are already working with endangered breeds on the Conservation Priority List. Previous recipients have improved farm safety, added marketing tools, upgraded equipment and improved their breeding herds.

Continuous Living Cover Grants



The Minnesota Department of Agriculture is accepting applications for a grant to develop enterprises, supply chains and markets for continuous living cover crops and cropping systems in the early stage of commercial development.

Continuous living cover refers to agricultural systems where living plants and roots are in the ground year-round, including winter cover crops, agroforestry and perennial crops.
