Member day at the Iowa State Fair builds connection and community

The Iowa State Fair is home of the butter cow, 4-H barns, giant turkey drumsticks – and this year, PFI's first member day at the fair!

Sporting bright "Don't Farm Naked" shirts, 30-plus PFI staff and members gathered at the fair, meeting up to socialize and connect with new and old friends.

PFI staff also entered the state fair's statue contest. Our statue, titled "Equipping Farmers to Build Resilient Farms and Communities," featured a design (pictured above) inspired by and in memory of long-time PFI member and farmer-leader Dan Specht, who developed, bred and shared his open-pollinated sweet corn, "Dan's Blue-Blond Sweet," for over a decade before he died suddenly in 2013.

The basket is swathed in PFI's barn quilt pattern, a nod to the barn quilts adorning the farmsteads of the past and present. The "husk" of the corn highlights PFI's "big tent," featuring field crops, horticulture, livestock and habitat.
