Meet a CoHort: Shad Swanson

**Shad Swanson** farms at Garden of Paradise in Essex, Iowa. He is also a founding member and leader at Life5b, a nonprofit collaboration that serves low-income people in rural southwest Iowa.

Why do you grow hort crops, in five words or less: To feed people.

What is something you're excited about this year: I am excited about my expansion and transition. Last year I farmed 1/5 of an acre and this year I have an acre that I shifted from row crops to vegetables, so I can feed more people and

make the business more viable for myself. I would love to see that happen on a much larger scale not only on my farm, but across the state.

What is one thing you would change about your industry: I would love to see farmers get away from the USDA Certified Organic label. As a farmer living in a super rural area with many low-income folks, I want everyone to be able to eat healthfully, and to me, that organic label unnecessarily drives up prices and makes it harder for people to access healthy, high-quality food.

**Favorite PFI memory:** I went to my first conference in 2024, and it was amazing. There was so much information that it was almost overwhelming. I can't wait for the next one!

**Your favorite crop and why:** Carrots! They are my favorite to grow and to eat. I have like 10 different colors this year, and they all taste amazing. Carrots sell well at the markets, and restaurants love them too.

# New research report: "Covering Brassica Seeds When Starting Transplants"



Starting seedlings is a chore where repeated movements like covering seeds with soil add up to a lot of time. A group of cooperators – **Jill Beebout**, **Hannah Breckbill, Emily Fagan**, **Natasha Hegmann, Pete Kerns, Roxane Mitten, Carly Zierke** and **Ethan Zierke** - wondered if covering seeds is worth their labor and results in higher germination rates or healthier starts. They agreed to explore this question with crops common to each of their farms - brassicas.
