NRCS funding for virtual fencing

The NRCS announced they will begin funding cost-share for virtual fencing for livestock. While exciting, implementation questions remain. To help address these

questions, PFI held a series of virtual sessions discussing how the technology works, including clarifying information from NoFence staff. NRCS staff also answered questions about how this technology will integrate with managed grazing plans through EQIP.

Research report: "Effects of Johnson-Su Compost Extract on Pasture Production and Quality"



Johnson-Su is a method of creating compost from wood chips or leaves in large, passively-aerated and watered piles. This method is attractive because the process does not smell or require turning. **Rory Van Wyk** wanted to determine the effects of compost extract created by the Johnson-Su method applied at the time of pasture establishment on pasture production and quality.

Research report: "Castration Timing in Goats and Sheep"



Castration of goat kids and lambs is a common practice, but the U.S. has no set regulations, and farmers castrate animals anywhere from a few days to several months old.

Castration affects the animal's hormones and therefore growth rate, meat fattiness and some physical development factors, like urethra size. Cooperators **Emily Fagan & Hannah Breckbill, Adam Ledvina** and **Bee Lutz** wondered if timing of kid or lamb castration would affect the final hanging weights of their animals or the general health in their herds.

Livestock grant application open



The Minnesota Department of Agriculture is accepting applications for its Livestock Investment Grant, which reimburses investments in:

- Buildings or facilities to produce livestock or livestock products.
- Development of pasture for use by livestock, including lanes, watering systems and fences.
- Equipment for livestock housing, confinement, feeding and waste management.

Applicants may apply for up to 10% of a project's total cost, with grants ranging from \$400 to \$25,000. **Learn more and apply.**

How good nutrition boosts honey bee resilience



In a <u>new study</u>, researchers at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign tackled a thorny problem: how do nutritional stress, viral infections and exposure to pesticides together influence honey bee survival? By looking at all three stressors together, the scientists found that good nutrition enhances honey bee resilience against the other threats.
