Cooperators' report on tarping for weed suppression

Tarping is an increasingly common practice on vegetable farms for bed preparation and weed or cover crop termination, especially in no-till or minimal-till systems.

Horticulture farmers **Hannah Breckbill** and Emily Fagan, along with Marlon Mormann, did an on-farm research project to answer questions relevant to their operations, including what duration of tarping is most effective for killing rye and if clear tarps can effectively get rid of perennial weeds. <u>Read the full research report.</u>

Iowa Valley RC&D's Fresh Connect Business Coaching Program is for small- to mid-scale crop and livestock farmers.

Farmers must have been in business for between one and six years with a stable farm location and plan to continue farming.
