Spanish-speaking farmers gain in-depth look at goat farming from "Year in the Life" series

At a recent field day in Red Oak, Iowa, a group of Spanish-speaking farmers and guests gathered at **Jenny Horner and Emilio Moreno's** farm, Spring Lake Organics, to learn about the basics of goat health. The event capped off a five-

part series on goat production at Spring Lake Organics that Jenny and Emilio hosted as part of PFI's "Year in the Life" series.

Now in its second year, the series is designed for Spanish-speaking farmers, aspiring farmers and their families to explore a specific farm enterprise throughout a growing season. This year's events explored the business of raising, grazing and marketing goats through Spanish-interpreted field days and virtual classes held on Google Classroom.

Two sets of farmer hosts – Jenny and Emilio, and **Adam Ledvina** of Chelsea, Iowa (note that **one field day remains at his farm**) – shared their knowledge at events held from early spring through fall. Each event featured seasonally relevant topics, from goat kidding and managing pasture to using electric netting and more.

Welcome Becca Snider to PFI staff




Becca Snider joined the Practical Farmers of Iowa staff in September 2024 as a finance assistant, responsible for accounts payable processing.
