Horticulture farmer conducts potato planting research



In 2024, **Lee Matteson** of Lee's Greens in Nevada, Iowa, set out to explore varying his planting dates of two potato varieties, Kennebec and Red Pontiac, to see if and how it would affect his yield.

Lee found that his early-planted Kennebec outperformed the late-planted Kennebec. However, it was a tough year for potatoes with wet conditions and high weed and pest pressure. Explore the full research report.
