Maddy Bartsch, who uses they and them pronouns, owns and operates Salt of the North Dye Garden at Get Bentz Farm near Northfield, Minnesota. While they have operated Salt and North Dye Garden for the past three years, they've been growing and teaching about plant-based dyes since 2016. For Maddy, growing

local color is their way of creating a thriving, decentralized textile economy in the Midwest.

PFI asked Maddy: What project are you most excited about on your farm?

Maddy: We are finishing the inside of the pole barn, including installing a wood-burning stove to host classes throughout the winter. I am excited to offer education, get messy, invite people to the farm to enjoy the day and dye together, but most importantly, to continue building community around the farm during our winter months.

PFI's produce safety cost-share applications open on Nov. 15



PFI's produce safety cost-share is for specialty crop farmers seeking to make on-farm food safety improvements.

Participants must spend at least \$2,200 on improvements and will receive a \$2,000 reimbursement. Improvements include installing a cooler or CoolBot system, enclosing a packing area, purchasing fencing and more.

Eligible farmers must farm in Iowa and have a PSA Grower Training Certificate.

Applications open Nov. 15 and close Dec. 31. **Learn more today.**

Iowa agricultural producers and private landowners can apply for funding by visiting their local NRCS office. Iowa has 100 NRCS field offices located at USDA Service Centers in every county.
