Meet a co-hort: Jim Ryan

Jim Ryan owns Ryan Farm in Buffalo Center, Iowa, where he raises orchard crops, berries, diverse vegetables, beef and poultry that he sells through on-farm sales,

at a farmers market and to restaurants.

Why do you grow hort crops, in five or fewer words: To eat well and it's more affordable to just grow it.

What is something you're excited about this year: Our farmhouse will get finished this year! I picked up the rest of the fossilized bamboo flooring so we can finish. On the farm side, there's so much going on that it's hard to pick one thing. The raspberries were a huge crop this year; we almost got tired of picking them.

What is one thing you would change about your industry: For the fruit and vegetable side, I don't have a problem selling produce because we sell to a lot of restaurants. But on our farm, we also have beef and poultry for meat. I would love to see more processing facilities for our beef and poultry. Because I sell to restaurants, I need a USDA-inspected processor. There are a lot of custom butchers, but so few of them are USDA-inspected, so that's a limitation.

Your favorite crop and why: Plums – I like to eat them! Apricots are great, too. It's fun to grow the rare stuff that not everyone grows.

PFI's produce safety cost-share enrollment is open



PFI offers a cost-share program for specialty crop farmers seeking to make on-farm food safety improvements. Participants must spend at least \$2,200 on improvements and will receive a \$2,000 reimbursement.

Improvements include installing a cooler or CoolBot system, enclosing a packing area, purchasing protective fencing and more. The cost-share is almost full so apply today.

Apply for the Empower Farmers Program



The Empower Farmers Program offers up-front payments to support the success of historically underserved farmers and ranchers by helping to reduce financial barriers.

These payments may be used for eligible farming expenses such as equipment, operating expenses, accounting software, contractor services and more.

Applicants may request between \$500 and \$2,000 in funding. **Apply by Dec. 31, 2024.**
