Farmer perspectives: Ben Penner's experience with diverse small grains in Minnesota

Ben Penner is a farmer and entrepreneur based in south central Minnesota. He grows organic wheat, Kernza and winter camelina as part of Ben Penner Farms. Beyond his own farm operations, Ben focuses on developing markets for small

grain and continuous living cover crops through his consulting business Aestiv LLC and as a board member for Perennial Promise Growers Cooperative.

Continuous growth: Ben started farming in Minnesota about 15 years ago with 32 acres which he transitioned to organic by 2010. In the ensuing years, he began growing heritage Turkey Red winter wheat and hard red spring wheat which he started selling to the St. Peter Food Co-op in 2016 as flour milled at Natural Way Mills in Middle River, Minnesota. To encourage ecosystem health, Ben gradually incorporated no-till and cover cropping whenever possible and began growing Kernza, a perennial wheatgrass, in 2019.

Establishing markets: Today, Ben's agricultural pursuits have expanded to more than 300 acres across four counties that he custom farms or custom markets. He has found success selling his products at various local stores, bakeries and breweries. "It takes key individuals to champion and believe in your product – usually a grocery store buyer," Ben says. "Just a couple people can really help you grow your sales. But you also have to be willing to face rejection sometimes."
