Orchardists gather to share knowledge at the Commercial Apple Growers Workshop

On an unusually warm day last Tuesday, more than 70 people gathered at Wilson's Orchard and Farm in Cumming, Iowa, for PFI's 2025 Commercial Apple Growers Workshop. In the morning, robust conversations explored weed control, orchard floor maintenance, integrated pest management, disease-resistant apple varieties, practices to build orchard resilience and more.

The event included a panel discussion of apple growers including **Paul Rasch** and **Kyle Tester** of Wilson's Orchard and Farm; **Dave Differding** of Timeless Prairie Orchard; **Chris Deal** of Deal's Orchard; **Marcus Johnson** of Buffalo Ridge Orchard; and **Michael Malik** of Long Land Orchard. In the afternoon, host Paul presented lessons learned in establishing this new orchard, followed by a tour and demonstration of pruning and training in a high-density system.

Video: "Cover Crops for Soil Health and Low-Cost Grazing"



In a new YouTube video, brothers **Landon Brown** and **Derek Brown** of New Providence, Iowa, talk about their initial decision to use cover crops for erosion control. Since then, they've noted other benefits including feed value, better soil biology and increased grazing.

In this video, Derek discusses how he uses a variety of seasonally appropriate cover crops to benefit their farm. He also shares his experiment with swath grazing the sorghum-sudan following corn stalks. Watch the video.

The Browns have seen how using cover crops lets them get into their fields earlier in the spring, especially during wet years. If this is something you've experienced or are curious about, sign up to participate in our research trial.
