Energizer discussion

Bigger is better

Best to have an indicator light for output amount (not just a fault indicator)

Remote turn off feature is a nice luxury

Energizer troubleshooting

-check around metal posts for contact with wire

-wire getting knocked off post

-net wrapped around bottom of support posts

Where to find tools/supplies (Pricing as of 6-19-2015)

Premier One Powerflex fence

Craigslist Auctions

Local farm store (large items that don't ship - posts, wire, staples)

Tips

High tensile is high maintenance (easy maintenance, but a lot of it)

Don't make lots of short fence lines Floating braces are difficult to do right
