




Raising Small Grains

- Drill Behind Beans/Corn (Nov. 6)
- 1.5-2 bu. Per Acre
- Vernalization
- May need Fungicide/2-4-D
- Pollination (May 28)
- Swathe Grain Mid July
- Combine (Jul 26)
- Bale
- Reseed (Aug 4)



Advantages of Adding a 3rd Crop

- Spreads out your work load
- Equipment/storage is available
- Find out what's going to break

before bean harvest

- Reduced Weed/Pest
 Pressure
- Smaller Input Costs
- Abundance of Straw
- Pasture Relief
